REPORT ABSTRACT

This report details the presentations, discussions, and conclusions held at the 18th Melaka International Youth Dialogue attended by selected stakeholders, consisting of young people and youth leaders from the respective National Youth Councils, the representatives of Youth Organisations, Ministries of Youth and Sports, Ministries of Housing and Development, Municipalities, Organisations that address urbanisation; CSOs; International Organisations; United Nations Agencies, and other establishments.

This report was compiled and published by the World Assembly of Youth.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This report summarises discussions and recommendations from the 18th Melaka International Youth Dialogue with the theme, **'Youth Engineering A Sustainable Urbanisation'**, held from 24th to 28th June 2018 at the Pantai Puteri Hotel in Melaka, Malaysia.

The Dialogue was organised by the World Assembly of Youth (WAY) in collaboration with the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF), the Ministry of Youth and Sports, Malaysia, Melaka State Government, the Asian Youth Council, the Commonwealth Youth Council, the Malaysian Youth Council and the Commonwealth Youth Innovation Center.

Among the youth and youth leader participants, in attendance were; Hon. Datuk Seri Utama Ir. Idris Haron, President of the World Assembly of Youth; Dr Amjad Rabi, Deputy Representative and Senior Social Policy Specialist at the UNICEF, Malaysia; Heads of Diplomatic Missions in Malaysia including Her Excellency Akua Sekyiwa Ahenkora, High Commissioner of the Republic of Ghana, His Excellency Kolinio Gata Takali, High Commissioner of the Republic of Fiji and His Excellency Houmdaophone Soukhaseum, Ambassador of the Embassy Lao PDR; Mr. Mohammed M. M. Suliman and Mr. Preye Jerome Ketebu-Brown, Vice Presidents of WAY; Dr Mohammed Maliki Mohammed Rapiee, Secretary General of the Asian Youth Council; Mr. Jufitri bin Joha, Vice President of the Malaysian Youth Council; representatives of the Commonwealth Youth Council and the Commonwealth Youth Innovation Centres; as well as Ms. Ediola Pashollari, Secretary General to the World Assembly of Youth.

WAY firmly believes that taking every action necessary in order to increase youth connectivity and harness their potential by uplifting ideas and leveraging the role of young people towards attaining a strategic and sustainable urbanisation. However, the public and private sectors must develop solid mutual understanding and operational partnerships, so that real benefits can be felt by both administrations and the citizens alike. The Melaka International Youth Dialogue is designed to provide an international platform for youth and youth leaders around the world, to create or amend youth related policies, increase collaboration between all stakeholders and improve youth connectivity.

INTRODUCTION

The Melaka International Youth Dialogue (MIYD) is an annual programme of the World Assembly of Youth (WAY) which brings together young people and youth leaders from around the world to discuss relevant youth issues.

Since 2001, the MIYD has convened on a wide range of issues. The MIYD has witnessed an escalating number of youth participants over the years, willing to participate in the decision making process. With the view of building a stronger partnership between the youth and all stakeholders, the MIYD produces a declaration which serves as a guideline for youth to address the selected issues.

By recognising the urgent issue of tackling urbanisation in contemporary lifestyle and its pertinence in attainment sustainable and resilient cities, WAY made it an obligation that this year, the 18th MIYD would encompass urbanisation as an enduring youth concern with the theme: **“Youth Engineering A Sustainable Urbanisation”** This theme had been recognised to fulfil the predominant opinions of young people. An interactive dialogue on this topic was significance to form, educate, increase awareness on the challenges and entitlements of youth for an opportunity and conducive platform that assures and supports their development fully at the different levels of society that they represent.

Youth play a key role in delivering this promise and has to be viewed and treated as assets and drivers of sustainable development. There is currently a

demographic “youth-bulge” in the developing world, where there are more people under the age of 25 today, totalling nearly three billion or almost half of the total global population. Hence, 1.3 billion of that total are between the ages of 12 and 24. These youth live, by and large, in cities and towns. The cities of the developing world account for over 90 percent of the world's urban growth and youth account for a large percentage of those inhabitants.

If youth are not included in urbanisation and governance processes, they would become idle resources to economic development. Unfortunately, it is not uncommon to encounter the poorly designed urbanisation that does not cater for the needs of youth in which it shall eventually become a significant source of poverty and inequality. Exclusion of youth in such activities like policy making in regard to issues affecting them could lead to a stronger informal sector and higher marginalisation, which, in turn, could cause a rise in social conflicts and even threaten the economic, social, and environmental stability of the respective countries

It is often said that youth are the leaders of tomorrow, well said, but youth should be seen as the leaders of today, as they could utilise the available platform and opportunity in order to contribute to the society and world at large. When youth are being seen as the leaders of today, more vital emphasis would be quickly placed on how to make them better, smarter, and influential. It all comes back to collaboration of all stakeholders, creating the right atmosphere for a better learning.

OBJECTIVES

Throughout the dialogue all participants gathered to call for action based on the following objectives:

- To find effective and efficient solution in ensuring adequate shelter for all;
- To discover means to promote security of residence, especially for those residing in the developing world;
- To come up with mechanism to support vulnerable groups as well as minorities, especially women and the poor;
- To uncover proper methods in providing adequate and equitable access to basic urban services;
- To promote awareness and analyse problems as well as inventories of programmes, services, facilities, and resources available related to youth roles in solving issues of urbanisation;
- To foster action and establish methods in order to effectively promote sustainable global urbanisation;
- To increase availability of more coordinated private and public investments in urban development and consequent improvement of cities' productivity, inclusiveness and environmental conditions;
- To identify the roles and contribution of different sectors i.e. public sector, private sector, city and national councils, NGOs and others, in promoting strategic urbanisation and supporting constructive youth development as well as youth leadership;
- To gather and select good practices, challenges, experiences, and lessons learned from the national youth councils towards improving or amending the current policies in order to contribute in promoting the ongoing urbanisation schemes;
- To distinguish well-defined responsibilities for the qualified agencies, institutions and personnel involved in preventive efforts;
- To form and advance the national, regional and international policies governing the attainment of sustainable urbanisation;
- To foster networking, collaboration and partnership among youth and all stakeholders in order to address the issue of urbanisation;
- To advance the role of youth and actively involve them in the social development and attainment of Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

PRE-EVENT STRUCTURE

Mindful of the importance of a systematic organising of the 18th MIYD and the efficient operation of this Dialogue, the already established preparatory committee, comprising of various institutions, organisations, and departments was chaired by Hon. Datuk Seri Utama Ir. Idris Haron, President of the World Assembly of Youth. The committee members, in their capacity, met on three separate preparatory meetings and discussed the relevant tasks and duties. All decisions made during these meetings were based on consensus. The Secretariat subsequently made follow ups after each meeting and before convening into the subsequent meeting.

The WAY Secretariat, headed by the Secretary General, Ms. Ediola Pashollari, performed the following necessary functions to ensure the efficient preparation of the Dialogue as set out below:

a. Administrative, budgetary and financial matters:

- Preparation of proposals and relevant documentations for accommodation, equipment, transportation, protocol requirements, that were provided to all organising committee, participants, volunteers and the Secretariat;
- Preparation of the estimated budget for the operation of the MIYD;
- Preparation of sponsorship proposal, recruitment of potential sponsors, dissemination of required documentations pertaining to sponsorship request and necessary follow-ups including those in securing the approved funds or grants;
- Introduction and provision of rules, training, tasks and duties was given to the selected Youth Volunteers that joined the Organising Committee;
- Steering the involvement and participation of partners towards the success of the event.

b. Institutional, procedural and legal matters:

- Assessment of proposals and approbation of the papers submitted by interested experts to be in accordance with the theme, “Youth Engineering A Sustainable Urbanisation” and the Millennium Plan of Action(MPAC-4) 2015 to 2018;
- Preparation of recommendations to the Preparatory Committee concerning the appropriate arrangements with respect to relations with other organisations participating and/or organising;
- Preparation and submission of a report on its activities to the institutions, organisations and government bodies involved in the MIYD;

c. Matters related to the activities of the MIYD within its scope and functions:

- Meetings and preparation towards the implementation of a successful Dialogue;
- Initiation of the work programme arising from discussions at the WAY Executive Committee meetings and also undertaking the work resulting from decisions of the Preparatory Committee meetings;
- Discussions on the suggestions for the inclusion of additional items on the agenda of the MIYD’s work programme; and
- Preparation of proposals concerning the composition of a Draft Declaration Committee in accordance with the criteria set out in the MIYD Documents and Agenda.

DIALOGUE PROGRAMME

The Dialogue agenda included plenary sessions, workshops, networking, working dinners, cultural performance, and excursion.

Plenary sessions composed of introductory speeches and paper presentations from national, regional, and international views of today, and also personal experience sharing from youth and other stakeholders with relevance to the theme. Following are the topics of the three plenary sessions for the 18th Melaka international Youth Dialogue:

- Plenary Session 1: Impacts of Urbanisation-Challenges and Opportunities
- Plenary Session 2: Youth Voices Toward A Sustainable Urbanisation
- Plenary Session 3: The Role of CSOs And NGOs

Workshops were brainstorming sessions and discussion platforms for participants. The "brainstorm" was very structured and focused and the participants were asked to learn and practice the ground rules.

In these sessions emphasis was made that there was no debate, no criticism, and no cross talk. Instead moderators called for suggestions and noted them, and later prioritised the list of suggestions to come up with a long term based Declaration. The recommendations constructed along these sessions were meant for relevant stakeholders, comprised of Public Sector, Private Sector, Non-Governmental Organisations, Media and Youth themselves.

1. OPENING CEREMONY:

To commence the 18th Melaka International Youth Dialogue in attendance were Hon. Datuk Seri Utama Ir. Idris Haron, President of the World Assembly of Youth who officiated the opening ceremony, Dr Amjad Rabi, Deputy Representative and Senior Social Policy Specialist at the UNICEF, Malaysia, and Heads of Diplomatic Missions in Malaysia including Her Excellency Akua Sekyiwa Ahenkora, High Commissioner of the Republic of Ghana, His Excellency Kolinio Gata Takali, High Commissioner of the Republic of Fiji, and His Excellency Houmdaophone Soukhaseum, Ambassador of the Embassy Lao PDR.

Besides, in attendance were also our renowned Vice Presidents of the World Assembly of Youth, Mr. Mohammed M. M. Suliman and Mr. Preye Jerome Ketebu-Brown, our own Secretary General, Ms. Ediola Pashollari as well as various other government representatives from all over the world.

The welcoming remarks were delivered by the Secretary General of the World Assembly of Youth, Ms. Ediola Pashollari, who explored the theme behind MIYD **“Youth Engineering A Sustainable Urbanisation”** and recapped the journey of the dialogue. On behalf of WAY, Ms. Ediola extended gratitude to all the youth organisations, government bodies, sponsors, speakers, delegates, and dignitaries for their great efforts and contribution to dialogue. She further stated that it is our duty to join hands and make contribution in solving issues such as urbanisation, and to give young people a voice to speak up on this matter.

After the welcoming remarks by Ms. Ediola, the video presentations of **‘Journey of MIYD’** was projected to all present in order to briefly introduce on the Melaka International Youth Dialogue (MIYD) and its topics for past 17 years. Subsequent to that video projection, another video on **‘Youth Engineering A Sustainable Urbanisation’** was shown to all attendees, explaining on the topic of 18th Melaka International Youth Dialogue (18th MIYD) and why it was pertinent to tackle the theme of Youth and Urbanisation.

President of the World Assembly of Youth, Hon. Datuk Seri Utama Ir. Idris Haron, who also officiated the opening ceremony, shared that the world has recently experienced an unprecedented increase in matters revolving around the subject of urbanisation which has led to both positive and negative effects. He also mentioned the importance of having appropriate activities and right policies in order to support and invest in urban and marginalised youth at an early stage, offering ample opportunities for education, employment, and inclusion as well as resilience for all. He encouraged the delegates to actively take part in the event as well as enjoy their stay in Melaka and Malaysia.

The opening ceremony was brought to conclusion with the presentation of tokens of appreciation to the guest of honours and dignitaries present as well as photo session with representatives from different countries.

2. PLENARY SESSIONS

SESSION I: IMPACTS OF URBANISATION-CHALLENGES AND OPPORTUNITIES

CHAIRPERSON: **Hon. Datuk Seri Utama Ir. Idris Haron**, *President of the World Assembly of Youth*

Speaker Topic: **“Urbanisation: International Trends, Challenges and Opportunities”**



By **Dr. Amjad Rabi**, *Deputy Representative and Senior Social Policy Specialist, UNICEF, Malaysia*

Dr. Amjad commenced his presentation by elaborating on urbanisation trends and projections, from year 1950 up to year 2050. He also explained that the urban growth was tremendously accelerated all around the world, especially in Asia and Africa. He updated that by the end of 2018, Asia would become a predominantly urban region with more people living in urban than in rural areas and Africa would catch up by year 2037.

He spoke on challenges of urbanisation and its extension areas which were mostly unplanned and too low-density to be able to finance necessary services and infrastructure. This unplanned and disproportional growth would lead to creation of slums conditions in the urbanised areas. He, then, went on explaining other opportunities and challenges of urbanisation, particularly those related to child welfare.

At the end of his presentation, he mentioned that for tackling urbanisation-related challenges and utilising its opportunities optimally, there were several priority areas that needed to be implemented; Those were reducing equity gaps in cities through technical support and partnerships; strengthening the evidence base in cities, data, policy and research; promoting a safe and clean urban environment; adapting urban planning and budgeting particularly for the most disadvantages; and enhancing the voice and participation of urban poor children and youth, and strengthening partnerships with urban communities and organisations.

Speaker Topic: **“Exploratory Study on Challenges and Issues of Urbanisation”**



By **Dr. Wesam AL Madhoun**, *Senior Lecturer and Researcher, University Teknologi Petronas, Palestine*

Dr. Wesam started his presentation by sharing his knowledge on the issue of air pollution which was increasingly important environmental and urbanisation issue globally.

As a Palestinian and former active researcher at the Islamic University of Gaza (IUG) in Gaza, Palestine, he explicated on two main environmental challenges in Gaza, air and noise pollutions

which were caused by traffic, generators, carpentries and workshops distributed all over the Gaza areas.

He also spoke on challenges of urbanisation which were revolved on matters pertaining to political and socio-economy factors; institutional and capacities (human resources and skills); other Important physical environmental challenges (water-solid waste); as well as financial and logistics issues (borders restrictions). At the final part of his presentation, Dr. Wesam focused on issues and challenges of urbanisation in more localised contexts within Malaysia, which included weak inter-governmental coordination and cooperation, trans-boundary pollution, lack of public awareness on pollution and health impacts; and political well of the decision makers (environmental achievement unseen by public).

Speaker Topic: **“Addressing the Issues and Challenges of Rapid Urbanisation”**



By **Mr. Fathudin Kamaruddin**, *President Youth Wing, Malaysian Institute of Planners, Malaysia*

Mr. Fathudin began his presentation by explaining on world-wide urbanisation trend in which emphasizes were made on those in Asia and African continents acknowledging their estimated, rapid urbanisation growth. He also provided statistical facts and projection on urbanisation in Malaysia-based context.

He also presented on prevailing issues and challenges in attainment of a good quality of life and sustainability in cities. These incorporated equitable and inclusive economic growth; addressing global warming and climate change; preserving agricultural areas and biodiversity; increasing social issues; building capacity; providing adequate social and infrastructure facilities; and strengthening urban governance.

At the end of his presentation, he recommended several steps in addressing the urbanisation issues and challenges, including communicating on the importance of New Urban Agenda (NUA) and its roles; analysing the state of relevant cities and the need for rapid assessment tool; developing strategies to translate NUA into plans and development objectives; as well as ensuring implementation of these strategies would meet the goals and objectives of NUA.

SESSION II: YOUTH VOICES TOWARD A SUSTAINABLE URBANISATION

CHAIRPERSON: **Mr. Nick Atkinson**, *Master of Ceremony*

Speaker Topic: **“Youth Participation in The Midst of Economic Growth and Urbanised Development”**



By **Dr. Abdul Wahed Jalal Nori**, *Senior Analyst, Institute of Strategic and International Studies, Iraq*

Dr. Abdul Wahed made his presence on the stage known by highlighting today's rapid economic growth and contemporary urbanised developing trend including its many challenges faced by youth, including marginalisation, technological advancement, insecurity and inequality, fierce competition, education, unemployment, under-employment, social issues, health, and many other issues.

He emphasised on the importance of providing a greater understanding of the changing nature of youth and including youth perspective on the government's broader agenda that would equip young people for their full, active participation in all aspect of their life. He further accentuated that providing young people with the support they need to succeed was part of governing in the long-term national interest.

He mentioned that any youth-policy-making must have ensured that young people's needs and perspectives were taken into account in all government businesses, and included the consequences of tomorrow as well as today. Ultimately, he closed his presentation by pointing out the key to rethink youth policy laid on inclusiveness of all stakeholders, to move from 'problem-oriented policy-making' towards 'future-directed, ethic-centred, vision-oriented, policy-making centred, and capacity-building oriented'.

Speaker Topic: **“Empowering Youth in Urban Rejuvenation”**



By **Mr. Mohd. Riduan bin Ngesan**, *Programme Executive, Think City Sdn. Bhd., Malaysia*

Mr Mohd Riduan shared relevant strategy and approach in creating more sustainable, inclusive, and resilient cities. He, started by introducing the Think City, a leading city-making organisation in Malaysia, aiming for implementation of innovative urban solutions, realisation of urban regeneration, and providing urban policy thinking.

He, then, went on explaining on city ecosystem which was comprised of infrastructure providers, businesses, urban planners and developers, community groups, research groups, and government. He added that successful cities focused on the end-users who were the people, and the Think City played a unique role in filling the gaps within this ecosystem to create better cities.

He shared on the Think City's beliefs on each individual's role in creating more sustainable, inclusive, and resilient cities, and this especially applied to the young people's roles. In Think City, youth engagement is its core principle as it ensures all of its plans becoming more relevant, meaningful, and responsive to young people's needs. The Think City looks at every opportunity to engage with youth, providing incentives, and encourage partnership with multi-disciplinary on various interest topics.

Speaker Topic: **"Melaka's Initiative towards Achieving Our 'Green Technology City By 2020"**



By **Mr. Badrul Hisham Badrudin**, CEO, My Bio Science Lab, Malaysia

In his presentation, Mr. Badrul provided case study of Melaka as the future Green Technology City of Malaysia. As one of the examples of Melaka's prior initiative, he used the case of the Melaka River which has undergone a rehabilitation and beautification project resulting in increasing its water quality.

He continued by explaining on Melaka green blueprint which supported Malaysia's Vision 2020 to be a high income, low carbon developed nation with a minimum GDP Per Capita of USD15,000 by the year 2020. Melaka is leveraging on three strategic objectives which are maintaining status as a developed state; achieving status as a city state; and achieving status as a green city.

He concluded his presentation by sharing about Melaka's Green City Action Plan (Melaka GCAP). This GCAP provides a set of recommendations that are aimed at maintaining Melaka's competitiveness as a popular tourist and investment destination, keeping environmental challenges to a minimum, and establishing the state as a role model for resilience and sustainability in the region.

SESSION III: THE ROLE OF CSOs and NGOs

CHAIRPERSON: **Mr. Dhanesh Basil**, *Coordinator of Commonwealth Youth Council*

Speaker Topic: **“Civil Society and SDGs: Youth for a Better Future”**



By **Ms. Maryam Majidova**, *Secretary General, National Assembly of Youth Organisations of the Republic of Azerbaijan, Azerbaijan*

Ms. Maryam, in her presentation, shared a unique approach in attainment of sustainable urbanisation by firstly achieving the 2030 Sustainable Development Goals. She focused on Azerbaijan's strategy, which started from October 2016 till today, in achievement of the 2030 Sustainable Development Goals. She added that these campaigns had objectives to raise awareness about SDGs, and empower civil society and especially young people to become ambassadors of SDGs in Azerbaijan.

At the end of her presentation, she gave detail information on three consecutive sub-procedures of “Promote”, “Advocate”, and “Act” which fell under SDGs campaigns conducted in Azerbaijan, particularly those that organised by the National Assembly of Youth Organisations of the Republic of Azerbaijan (NAYORA). She also projected few videos to all participants in order to share some of the initiatives taken pertaining to the implementation of these campaigns.

Speaker Topic: **“Leading A Generation To Change The World Through Entrepreneurship”**



By **Mr. Tauseef Rasheq Ahad**, *Regional Director and national Director, Hult Prize Foundation, Bangladesh*

Mr. Tauseef started his presentation by emphasizing the importance of education in attainment of sustainable urbanisation. He gave some of examples in Bangladesh of how poor education could affect the employable opportunity for those unfortunates and then, impact on their well-beings. He further uttered that hundred millions of children were trapped in child-labor, instead of enrolled in basic education. Millions of young people were also engaged in hazardous labour, forced labour and modern-day slavery.

He continued that in midst of the brink of Industrial Revolution 4.0, climate change and lack of basic rights for millions, it is high time for youth to step forward and be the catalysts of change. He added that through social entrepreneurship, youth could work on the 17 United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals and create startups that impact people on grass-root levels, and change lives of thousands around them.

He closed his presentation by saying that the first step is always the hardest. However, if youth can be encouraged to create something and see the result in front of their eyes, that is the moment when their lives are changed as they change the world around them.

Speaker Topic: **“Role of Indigenous Knowledge in Urban DRR”**



By **Mr. Ganesh Dhungana**, *Executive Director, Action Nepal, Nepal*

Mr. Ghanesh Dhungana engaged the audiences with a unique topic on the role of indigenous knowledge in the Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR): to avoid, prevent, and deal with disasters. He mentioned that the role of indigenous knowledge in Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR) has not received the attention it deserves, especially in many less developed countries, including Nepal. This approach of indigenous knowledge role which he shared that day was based on a study conducted in Nepal that has experienced devastating earthquakes in 2015.

He continued by sharing about urban tendency to natural disasters and different kinds of interventions which reduced risk and vulnerability. He also briefed on the systematic review which was included in that study, covered different programs and involvement by governments, NGOs, international organisations or donor agencies to manage environmental effects of urbanisation.

For the first stage of the review, any intervention along the continuum of Disaster Risk Management i.e. pre-disaster, disaster response, and post-disaster was included. In the second stage, interventions that aimed to manage the environmental impact of urbanisation was included for further analysis of environment management techniques, concerning improved land use and watershed management, preparedness programs as well as those entailing extensive community engagement and participation, and urban risk assessments.

Speaker Topic: **“Youth in Sustainable Environment and Community Engagement-NGOs Perspective”**



By **Ms. Rene Fu Swee Yun**, *Youth Activist, Zero Waste Malaysia, Malaysia*

Ms. Rene began her presentation by explicating on environmental impacts, including those affecting animals, due to excessive and irresponsible wastes produced by today civilization. She invited all attendees to rethink about the social and environmental responsibilities. She added that NGOs as the state holders should have actively contributed in community engagement via awareness

programme, advocacy, capacity building, community activities, and community engagement.

She also touched on how the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), especially *Goal 12: Responsible Consumption and Production* and *Goal 17: Partnership for the Goals* in achieving sustainable environment and urbanisation. She added that sustainable environment and urbanisation could be achieved by effectively using resources, and minimising waste and pollution.

In addition, she emphasized on the importance of multi-stakeholder partnerships in terms of knowledge, expertise, and technology sharing as well as financial support as the ways forward. She suggested for NGOs to work closely with local government in expanding the sustainable initiative; promoting zero waste, low carbon cities, and sustainable living; as well as engaging young planners and community as a whole.

3. WORKSHOPS:

Based on the introductory perspective and case studies from the invited speakers who led structured discussions of the relevant issues pertaining to the theme, the practicality of involving the youth in decision making process was born in the workshops which were considered interactive and brainstorming sessions.

In the workshops the participants were divided into groups, and asked to discuss on the challenges and roles played by all stakeholders in relation to attainment of sustainable urbanisation. This later led into the creation of the Draft Declaration which was later presented to the participants for its adoption. *Refer to Pictures in the Appendix*

4. DECLARATION:

The declaration is a document bearing recommendations agreed by the participants that they feel ought to be implemented by all relevant stakeholders. The participants through their thorough discussions, thoughts, and experiences during the plenary sessions and workshops, and guided by the dialogue objectives agree to the final draft declaration in unity as they were brought together for the dialogue.

The adopted declaration was then distributed to all participants present and later on published, and forwarded to all WAY members and other related institutions. *Refer to the Appendix*

5. EXCURSION:

The excursion was organised as a free and easy networking session among all participants, volunteers, and members of the organising committee. Utilising the strategic location of 18th Melaka International Youth Dialogue (18th MIYD) venue which was just beside the mesmerizing Puteri Beach in Melaka, Malaysia, this excursion session included in agenda on 28th June 2018, in order to provide bonding opportunity for all, and serving as an informal field trip pertaining to sustainable urbanisation. This excursion activity indirectly highlighted the importance of natural sites that every urbanised area should sustain in preserving the cultural and natural value in the resilient cities. This excursion was very substantial as it played a very significant role, adding a remarkable feather to the cap of the entire dialogue. *Refer to Pictures in the Appendix*

6. CLOSING CEREMONY:

The closing ceremony of the 18th Melaka International Youth Dialogue commenced with the reading of the adopted declaration.

Secretary General of the World Assembly of Youth, Miss Ediola Pashollari, initiated the evening with her remarks, where she welcomed and thanked all respected guests, speakers, sponsors, participants, and volunteers. She also expressed her gratitude for the development of the declaration and the level of commitment demonstrated by everyone present during the entire dialogue. She stated that "youth should now take ownership to this declaration... they should take it to their peers, organisations, and other stakeholders in their respective countries, for implementation". She, then, acknowledged the input of all dignitaries and organisers, and she hoped for a continuous relation and cooperation among the youth, WAY, National Youth Councils, Youth Organisations, and Government Representative Bodies.

Remarks were also given by Secretary General of the Asian Youth Council, Dr. Mohammed Maliki Mohammed Rapiee who praised the great commitment of all international delegates who travelled from the other parts of the world in order to join the effort of engineering a sustainable urbanisation for all. The pulpit was later left for Hon. Datuk Seri Utama Ir. Idris Haron, President of the World Assembly of Youth. He appreciated the participants for their time and patience during this dialogue and everyone who has made themselves present from the beginning of this dialogue to the end. He ended his speech by thanking the hard working organising committee and not to forget, the sponsors for their kind assistance and endless support.

The closing ceremony was attended by various dignitaries including Mr. Mohammed M. M. Suliman and Mr. Preye Jerome Ketebu-Brown, Vice Presidents of the World Assembly of Youth; Dr. Mohammed Maliki Mohammed Rapiee, Secretary General of the Asian Youth Council; Mr. Jufitri bin Joha, Vice President of the Malaysian Youth Council; and Miss Romeena Singh, First Secretary of the Fiji High Commission.

The closing ceremony was concluded with a dinner, followed by certificate and awards presentation, souvenir presentation, and photo session. This astonishing night was also completed with cultural show by the Udvas Dance Art Academy and musical performance by one of the local bands, the Zas Band. All dignitaries, participants, organisers, and volunteers celebrated the end of the dialogue as one.

DELEGATES

This year's MIYD, '**Youth Engineering A Sustainable Urbanisation**' was graced by about 150 youth and youth leaders from 42 countries as expected by the organisers. The participants were able to tap into the invaluable insights of the forerunners in the urbanisation field and those champions elucidating on recent developments and challenges while exploring better youth and urbanisation policies in the world.

The participants recognized the Dialogue as a potential driver for attainment of sustainable urbanisation and indulged in efforts to exploit the benefits that could be reaped from others present.

This intensified the atmosphere of self-motivation, and great networking groups formed as was the initial intention of the Melaka International Youth Dialogue to bring together young people and youth leaders to discuss this imminent issue, and also formulate a guideline that encompasses the suggestions brought forward during the workshop sessions.

With the outcome document, the declaration, WAY Secretariat trusts that the delegates will play their role in disseminating the gained information to all their relevant institutions in their respective countries; form partnership with all relevant stakeholders; and also reach to the grass root levels and the community as a whole, with the aim to promote young people's right to resilient cities and sustainable urbanisation.

We look forward to witnessing more initiatives from all stakeholders, young people inclusive, given that it is locally, regionally or internationally implemented, in order to realise all recommendations established during this dialogue. DECLARATION

1 PREAMBLE

- 1.1 We, the 140 young people from 42 countries around the world, attended the 18th Melaka International Youth Dialogue (MIYD), convened in Melaka from 24th– 28th June, 2018 for an annual program organised by the World Assembly of Youth (WAY).
- 1.2 Recognising the vital role of young people on sustainable urbanisation, and following the recent adopted Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and latest Urban Agenda, WAY has made an obligation to encompass the sustainability of urbanisation and resilience of all cities as an enduring concern faced by the youth and themed the 18th Melaka International Youth Dialogue “Youth Engineering A Sustainable Urbanisation”.
- 1.3 This theme has emphasised on the actions that young people and other stakeholders should take towards addressing and attaining sustainable urbanisation. This dialogue has identified the roles and concerns of all stakeholders towards urbanisation issues, and declared that now is the right time and opportunity to act in partnership.

The guiding principles for this declaration were based on the following objectives:

- To find effective and efficient solutions in ensuring adequate shelter for all;
- To discover means to promote security of residence, especially for those residing in the developing world;
- To come up with mechanisms to support vulnerable groups as well as minorities, especially women and the poor;
- To uncover proper methods in providing adequate and equitable access to basic urban services;
- To search for appropriate approaches in promoting decentralisation and good urban governance globally.
- To promote awareness and analyse problems as well as inventories of programmes, services, facilities, and resources available related to youth roles in solving issues of urbanisation;
- To foster action and establish methods in order to effectively promote sustainable global urbanisation;

- To increase availability of more coordinated private and public investments in urban development and consequent improvement of cities' productivity, inclusiveness and environmental conditions.
- To identify the roles and contribution of different sectors i.e. public sector, private sector, city and national councils, NGOs and others, in promoting strategic urbanisation and supporting constructive youth development as well as youth leadership;
- To gather and select good practices, challenges, experiences, and lessons learned from the national youth councils towards improving or amending the current policies in order to contribute in promoting the on-going urbanisation schemes;
- To distinguish well-defined responsibilities for the qualified agencies, institutions and personnel involved in preventive efforts;
- To form and advance the national, regional and international policies governing the attainment of sustainable urbanisation;
- To foster networking, collaboration and partnership among youth and all stakeholders in order to address the issue of urbanisation;
- To advance the role of youth and actively involve them in the social development and attainment of Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

2. RECOMMENDATIONS

Participants have identified key recommendations for implementation by stakeholders including: public sector, private sector, NGOs/IGOs, media, and young people alike. In addition, participants also established commitments and outcomes in pursuit of sustainable urbanisation globally.

2.1 PUBLIC SECTOR

- 2.1.1. To initiate, establish, implement and enforce local, national, and regional policies related to Specific, Measureable, Attainable, Realistic, and Time Bound (SMART) pre-planning of urban and rural areas.
- 2.1.2. To review and strengthen existing laws in line with global agreements, communicate and resolutions in order to attain sustainable urbanisation.
- 2.1.3. To ensure meaningful youth participation and engagement in policy and decision making processes in order to achieve sustainable urbanisation.
- 2.1.4. To encourage partnership between youth and all stakeholders and conduct capacity building and awareness programmes in order to address issues faced by the youth within urban and rural areas.
- 2.1.5. To introduce educational curriculum that encourages and promotes the concept of sustainable urbanisation starting at primary level.
- 2.1.6. To provide and allocate adequate resources to the youth and youth organisations in order to acquire the required skills and knowledge to tackle issues related to urbanisation.
- 2.1.7. To provide equal facilities and opportunities in rural and urban areas that would strive towards a balanced sustainable and economic development at the national level.

- 2.1.8. To ensure that relevant stakeholders comply with the Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) in order to mitigate the negative impact of their activities on the environment.

2.2 PRIVATE SECTOR

- 2.2.1 To allocate and invest an adequate amount of Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) resources for the pursuit of related sustainable urbanisation programmes and activities.
- 2.2.2 To provide interest free loans and grants for the youth to facilitate growth and developments in the rural and urban areas.
- 2.2.3 To adapt the 5R principles (Refuse, Reduce, Reuse, Recycle, and Rot) in corporate policy planning and implementation to ensure a sustainable urbanisation.
- 2.2.4 To pursue a healthy balance of economic and social development in order to achieve sustainable urbanisation.
- 2.2.5 To encourage partnership with relevant stakeholders, youth inclusive, using directed sustainable urbanisation awareness campaigns.
- 2.2.6 To allocate sufficient resources towards research and development for sustainable urbanisation.

2.3 NON-GOVERNMENT ORGANISATIONS

- 2.3.1 To design, support and carry out participatory programmes on sustainable urbanisation at urban and rural areas.
- 2.3.2 To carry out evidence based research and advocacy on urban and rural issues at all levels.
- 2.3.3 To develop impactful sustainable urbanisation oriented awareness and campaign programmes targeted at all stakeholders.
- 2.3.4 To create training and capacity building programmes designed to empower the youth in the field of sustainable urbanisation advocacy to the decision makers.
- 2.3.5 To provide resources to other organisations that promote, tackle and support sustainable urbanisation projects and programmes.
- 2.3.6 To design and deliver fellowship and training programmes for young people on sustainable urbanisation.

2.4 MEDIA

- 2.4.1 To dedicate space in all media outlets that would promote and educate the people on the importance of sustainable urbanisation.

- 2.4.2 To periodically share impactful and quality information and good practices on sustainable urbanisation to the broader public through public and private media.
- 2.4.3 To create awareness and educational programmes on sustainable urbanisation at all levels.
- 2.4.4 To encourage and influence all stakeholders in developing and implementing vital policies in order to achieve sustainable urbanisation.

2.5 YOUTH

- 2.5.1 To create and implement sustainable urbanisation awareness and advocacy programmes to be carried out by the youth for the youth.
- 2.5.2 To ensure meaningful youth participation on activities that promotes sustainable urbanisation for all.
- 2.5.3 To voice out issues and present solutions related to urbanisation via social media and other avenues.
- 2.5.4 To establish platforms on sustainable urbanisation that would strengthen meaningful youth participation at the local, national, regional and international level.
- 2.5.5 To engage young people in urban and rural areas on sustainable urbanisation and ensure inclusiveness at all levels.

3 CONCLUSION

We, the participants of the 18th Melaka International Youth Dialogue, recognise the importance of empowering and equipping the young people with the right knowledge, skills, proper attitude and approach for achieving sustainable urbanisation. Recognising that in line with the adoption of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and Urban Agenda, we the young people, should be at the forefront of universal transformation taking actions in order to advocate and protect the cities and human settlements that are inclusive, safe, resilient, and sustainable. DECLARACIÓN

1 PREÁMBULO

- 1.4 Nosotros, los 140 jóvenes de 42 países de todo el mundo, asistimos al 18° Melaka Diálogo Internacional de la Juventud (MIYD), convocado en Melaka del 24 al 28 de Junio de 2018 para un programa anual organizado por la Asamblea Mundial de la Juventud (WAY).
- 1.5 Reconociendo el papel vital de los jóvenes en la urbanización sostenible, y siguiendo los recientes Objetivos de Desarrollo Sostenible (ODS) y la última Agenda Urbana, WAY se ha comprometido a abarcar la sostenibilidad de la urbanización y la resiliencia de todas las ciudades como una preocupación permanente la juventud y temática del 18 ° Melaka Diálogo Internacional de la Juventud "La ingeniería juvenil una urbanización sostenible".
- 1.6 Este tema ha enfatizado las acciones que los jóvenes y otras partes interesadas deberían tomar para abordar y lograr la urbanización sostenible. Este diálogo ha identificado los roles y las preocupaciones de todas las partes interesadas con respecto a los problemas de urbanización, y ha declarado que ahora es el momento y la oportunidad adecuados para actuar en asociación.

Los principios rectores para esta declaración se basaron en los siguientes objetivos:

- Encontrar soluciones eficaces y eficientes para garantizar un refugio adecuado para todos;
- Descubrir medios para promover la seguridad de residencia, especialmente para aquellos que residen en el mundo en desarrollo;
- Crear mecanismos para apoyar a los grupos vulnerables y a las minorías, especialmente las mujeres y los pobres;
- Descubrir métodos adecuados para proporcionar un acceso adecuado y equitativo a los servicios urbanos básicos;
- Buscar enfoques apropiados para promover la descentralización y la buena gobernanza urbana a nivel mundial.
- Promover la toma de conciencia y analizar los problemas, así como los inventarios de programas, servicios, instalaciones y recursos disponibles relacionados con los roles de los jóvenes en la solución de problemas de urbanización;
- Fomentar la acción y establecer métodos para promover efectivamente la urbanización global sostenible;
- Incrementar la disponibilidad de inversiones privadas y públicas más coordinadas en el desarrollo urbano y la consiguiente mejora de la productividad, la inclusión y las condiciones ambientales de las ciudades.

- Identificar los roles y la contribución de diferentes sectores, es decir, el sector público, el sector privado, los consejos municipales y nacionales, las ONG y otros, en la promoción de la urbanización estratégica y el apoyo al desarrollo constructivo de los jóvenes, así como al liderazgo juvenil;
- Reunir y seleccionar buenas prácticas, desafíos, experiencias y lecciones aprendidas de los consejos nacionales de la juventud para mejorar o enmendar las políticas actuales a fin de contribuir a promover los esquemas de urbanización en curso;
- Para distinguir las responsabilidades bien definidas para las agencias calificadas, instituciones y personal involucrado en esfuerzos preventivos;
- Formar y avanzar en las políticas nacionales, regionales e internacionales que rigen el logro de la urbanización sostenible;
- Promover la creación de redes, la colaboración y la asociación entre los jóvenes y todas las partes interesadas a fin de abordar el problema de la urbanización;
- Avanzar en el rol de los jóvenes e involucrarlos activamente en el desarrollo social y el logro de los Objetivos de Desarrollo Sostenible (ODS).

2. RECOMENDACIONES

Los participantes han identificado recomendaciones clave para la implementación por parte de los interesados, incluidos: sector público, sector privado, ONG / OIG, medios de comunicación y jóvenes por igual. Además, los participantes también establecieron compromisos y resultados en la búsqueda de una urbanización sostenible a nivel mundial.

2.1 SECTOR PÚBLICO

- 2.1.3. Asegurar la participación significativa de los jóvenes y la participación en las políticas y procesos de toma de decisiones para lograr una urbanización sostenible.
- 2.1.4. Fomentar la asociación entre los jóvenes y todas las partes interesadas y llevar a cabo programas de creación de capacidad y sensibilización para abordar los problemas que enfrentan los jóvenes en las zonas urbanas y rurales.

DÉCLARATION

1. PREAMBULE

- 1.1 Nous, les 140 jeunes des 42 pays du monde, avons assisté au 18e Dialogue International des Jeunes de Melaka (MIYD), organisé à Melaka du 24 au 28 juin 2018 pour un programme annuel organisé par l'Assemblée Mondiale des Jeunes (WAY).
- 1.2 Reconnaissant le rôle vital des jeunes dans l'urbanisation durable et suite aux récents Objectifs du développement durable (ODD) et au dernier Agenda urbain, WAY a imposé l'obligation de considérer la durabilité de l'urbanisation et la résilience de toutes les villes comme une préoccupation persistante. La jeunesse est le thème du 18e Dialogue international de la jeunesse de Melaka «L'ingénierie de la jeunesse, une urbanisation durable».
- 1.3 Ce thème a mis l'accent sur les actions que les jeunes et les autres parties prenantes doivent entreprendre pour aborder et atteindre l'urbanisation durable. Ce dialogue a identifié les rôles et les préoccupations de toutes les parties prenantes en ce qui concerne les questions d'urbanisation, et a déclaré que le moment et l'opportunité sont maintenant bons pour agir en partenariat.

Les principes directeurs de cette déclaration reposaient sur les objectifs suivants:

- Trouver des solutions efficaces pour assurer un logement convenable pour tous;
- Découvrir des moyens de promouvoir la sécurité de la résidence, en particulier pour ceux qui résident dans le monde en développement;
- Proposer des mécanismes pour soutenir les groupes vulnérables ainsi que les minorités, en particulier les femmes et les pauvres;
- Trouver des méthodes appropriées pour assurer un accès adéquat et équitable aux services urbains de base;
- Rechercher des approches appropriées pour promouvoir la décentralisation et la bonne gouvernance urbaine au niveau mondial;
- Promouvoir la sensibilisation et l'analyse des problèmes ainsi que l'inventaire des programmes, services, installations et ressources disponibles liés aux rôles des jeunes dans la résolution des problèmes d'urbanisation;
- Encourager l'action et établir des méthodes afin de promouvoir efficacement l'urbanisation mondiale durable;
- Accroître la disponibilité d'investissements publics et privés plus coordonnés dans le développement urbain et par conséquent l'amélioration de la productivité, de l'inclusivité et des conditions environnementales des villes;
- Identifier les rôles et la contribution des différents secteurs, à savoir le secteur public, le secteur privé, les conseils municipaux et nationaux, les ONG et autres, dans la

promotion de l'urbanisation stratégique et le soutien au développement des jeunes et au leadership des jeunes;

- Recueillir et sélectionner les bonnes pratiques, les défis, les expériences et les enseignements tirés des conseils nationaux de la jeunesse en vue d'améliorer ou de modifier les politiques actuelles afin de contribuer à la promotion des programmes d'urbanisation en cours;
- distinguer les responsabilités bien définies des agences, institutions et personnels qualifiés impliqués dans les efforts de prévention;
- Formuler et faire progresser les politiques nationales, régionales et internationales régissant la réalisation de l'urbanisation durable;
- Favoriser le réseautage, la collaboration et le partenariat entre les jeunes et tous les intervenants afin de régler le problème de l'urbanisation;
- Promouvoir le rôle des jeunes et les impliquer activement dans le développement social et la réalisation des objectifs de développement durable (ODD).

2. RECOMMANDATIONS
